BRIGADIER GENERAL ROBERT L. SCOTT, JR. MEMORIAL GOLF TOURNAMENT SET FOR MARCH 27

WARNER ROBINS, GA -- The Museum of Aviation Foundation will present the 12th Annual Brigadier General Robert L. Scott, Jr. Memorial Golf Scramble on March 27th at Idle Hour Country Club in Macon, Ga.

Scott, Macon's hometown hero, became a fighter ace and author during World War II. He served for two decades as the Museum of Aviation Foundation's National Fundraising Chairman. Scott passed away 11 years ago on February 27 – two months before his 98th birthday. His memory lives on at the Museum of Aviation with an exhibit, a P-40 fighter and a simple mission he instilled in everyone he met – “make the next generation better.”

The tournament is a four-person scramble and will include breakfast, noon lunch at the clubhouse, green fees, riding cart, range balls, a distinctive commemorative golf shirt and an awards presentation following the afternoon round.

Golfers have the choice of an 8 a.m. or 1:30 p.m. tee time. Sponsorships are still available and are as follows: Super Sponsors at \$5,000 (6 players), Tournament Sponsors at \$2,500 (4 players), Flag Sponsors at \$750 (2 players) and Hole Sponsorship at \$450 (1 player). Individual Players are \$175.

Golfers and a guest are invited to the evening awards presentation at Idle Hour Country Club following the afternoon round.

Mark Stevens will once again chair the tournament committee, with co-chairs Oliver Bateman, III, Malcolm Burgess, Jr., Marshall Butler, Guy Eberhardt, Lowell Register and Bill Wiley. Chair Emeritus is Carolyn Clayton.

Tournament proceeds help fund the growth and development of the Museum of Aviation. Last year the Museum welcomed 52,000 students with science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) heritage programs for children, teachers and adults.
