1. Georgia Aviation Hall of Fame member _____ distinguished himself as a pilot on May 12, 1968, at Kham Duc, Republic of Vietnam, as he maneuvered the lumbering unarmed Fairchild C-123 Provider transport in position for a landing at the beleaguered Special Forces camp that had been overrun by hostile forces, in a desperate rescue of a three-man Combat Control Team. The mission was successful and for his heroic action under brutal enemy fire, Colonel Jackson was awarded the Medal of Honor on January 16, 1969.
2. Georgia Aviation Hall of Fame member _____ served as Commander of Warner Robins Air Logistics Center, Robins Air Force Base, Georgia, where he was instrumental in establishing the Engineering School at Mercer University and developing the Museum of Aviation at Robins Air Force Base.
3. The _____ aircraft was the first production aircraft with a variable geometry or "swing wing". The wing design supported both subsonic flight and supersonic flight.
4. The _____ aircraft was a heavily modified _____ aircraft to add a guidance system that could position the aircraft to fire the AIR-2A "Genie" rocket and return to base.
5. The _____ is a sweep-wing fighter from the Korean War. The aircraft on display flew with the Maryland Air National Guard.
6. The _____ aircraft holds the Absolute Speed Record of _____ mph flown on July 28, 1976.
7. The _____ aircraft was once modified for by adding an arresting hook for a series of experimental landings on the aircraft carrier USS America.
